Introduction

Scriptures are abundant throughout the barrios of New Mexico. They decorate colorful murals, tattoo the locals in Old English lettering, are quoted from the mouths of the elders to give life advice, and woven into expressions at la resolana, a term used to refer to the south-facing wall where the sun hits and the locals congregate.

Historic murals adorn the walls, depicting the trauma of the Spanish conquest, the uprooting of the indigenous, and the invasion of the United States. Endless bloodshed and abusive power has been justified by man in the name of God. In grief painted on the wall, the barrio depicts it all. Throughout history, religion has frequently boasted a spirit of shaming others, a complete contradiction to what God represents. This book focuses on the unconditional, attainable love of God that is in EVERYTHING. "Let all that you do be done in love."

I've spent endless mornings in my own resolana at home with friends and family reflecting together on the wonders of life and the beauty of God. I began to write most of my prayers there during one of the most difficult times of my life. My mind was too overwhelmed to stay in uninterrupted prayer, and it centered my focus to write them down. These prayers became my strength to face each day. Releasing my vulnerabilities while claiming courageous words over my life through my conversations with God was what carried me through my healing.

My prayers are my power to persevere in this precious life, which also devastates me at times when I surrender to powerless thinking.

I have found that my greatest healing has come from showing love to others. In January 2020 I read this scripture: "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself." (Philippians 2:3) The depths of the true meaning of this spoke to me in a new way. I prefer this old translation which uses the word "esteem" - closer to cherish and appreciate.
